Voice 21 Oracy work



One of the elements that we pride ourselves on at Radstock Primary School is our work on Oracy - the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language. We encourage children to speak in full sentences and develop their learning and ideas through talk. When asking a question, our teachers give everyone the opportunity to talk by using talk partners to allow the children to talk to each other, before coming back together for an answer. We are working with Voice 21 to develop our Oracy strategies and Miss Beaumont, our Oracy leader, has contributed in discussions which have been shared with teachers and schools across the country on Radstock's journey to develop Oracy.



We feel "talk" is such an important life skill - throughout the pandemic, the ability to talk to each other over the internet has been an essential way to keep in touch with work, family and friends - and you may feel the same. Miss Beaumont has put together, with the help of Mrs Prowse's husband, some top tips to develop discussion at home, as well as some suggested ways to start discussions with your child/ren. These posters and further information are accompanying this newsletter today.

Homework

Thank you to all parents who attended our Transition meetings over the last two weeks. If you weren't able to make it, videos of the recordings are available on your child's Google Classroom page and the powerpoints are available on the school website. A key priority for homework at Radstock is ensuring that children develop those key skills essential to reading, writing and mathematics. It is our expectation that your child reads or is heard read a minimum of 5 times a week. In addition, we also expect that your child learns their spellings and watches the pre-learning video available on Google Classroom once they are in Year 1 onwards.

We are about to introduce Accelerated Reader to the children in Key Stage 2 which is a way of promoting reading and have revamped our library collection. Thank you to those parents who supported our mini-book sale last week. Once it is launched, children will be encouraged to become Word Millionaires by reading as many books as they can over the year.



Once your child is in Year 1, they should also be using Numbots or Times Table Rockstars regularly to develop their knowledge of key number facts. Further details of timings is available in Curriculum News!

COVID-19 Update

Be cautious. Be careful. Be kind.



I just wanted to remind you all of the key messages around COVID-19 now that restrictions have eased. We are still being cautious in school and are only mixing small groups of children - 2 year groups for assemblies or for Read Write Inc - or larger groups outside. Where we have had a positive case, as we now have in one year group, we have stopped the children from gathering together in assemblies in the short term.

We would ask that you continue to be cautious as well by observing the following:

• If your child has a cough, temperature or loss of taste or smell, please book a PCR test via NHS 111. A lateral flow test is **not** the same as a PCR and can miss positive cases. We have seen children with other symptoms, including headaches, stomach upsets, sore throats and being

unusually tired, so if you are worried, please book a test. The office team may ask you to get your child tested if we are concerned about symptoms.

- Whilst your child is being tested, they should remain home from school if they have symptoms as self-isolation rules still remain for symptomatic individuals.
- Work is uploaded onto Google Classroom each week for all pupils to complete if they are off school and well enough to complete it.
