Curriculum News

The Curriculum News for the Spring term will be sent out on Monday - apologies, but it has been delayed by our visitors last week. This document contains information about what the children are studying. We have been working on our curriculum over the last 3 years and are constantly developing and improving it.

In order to ensure that the children deepen their knowledge, particuarly in history and geography, we have moved to a learning project over an entire term for children in Key Stage 1 and 2, or Years 1 to 6. Science will then be taught separately, rather than combined with the learning projects in the way it was previously.

We have noticed that there have been an increase in the number of requests for family holidays recently, as a result of the easing of restrictions on foreign travel. Not only will this absence not be authorised by the school, I would like to politely remind you that children should be in school as much as possible!

The impact of two years of disturbed schooling, because of the lockdowns and COVID, mean that children should be in school regularly. Two weeks holiday, plus a week's isolation can have a serious impact on children's learning. Please keep those holidays for when the school is closed.

COVID-19 Update

Be cautious. Be careful. Be kind.



For all parents

We know that some of the rules around COVID have changed recently, which do appear to be quite confusing. I wanted to update and remind you of the situation.

Firstly, if your child has a positive LFD test and no symptoms, they do not need to undertake a PCR test. The LFD test will count as "Day 0" and then the 10 days self-isolation starts from the following day. If your child has symptoms, and they can be different to the typical cough, temperature or loss of taste and smell, the individual should get a PCR test and self-isolate until the result is known.



From Day 5 onwards, anyone who has had a positive LFD or PCR result can take an LFD test. If the individual tests negative on Day 5 and Day 6 on LFDs and doesn't have a temperature, they are able to come into school. This then continues daily up until Day 10. Please see the diagram for further information.

We are asking families who have a close contact within the household to keep their child at home for the first 5 days, as this is when transmission generally occurs. If they are continuing to test negative on LFDs and have not developed symptoms, they can then return to school.

Online work is available for all pupils to access via Google Classroom as long as they are well enough.

We now have 4 classes, in Year 3 and Year 5, who have entered the contingency framework. Children in these classes should be testing on LFD tests daily for 7 days. Please support us with this testing regime as it prevents further spread of the virus across the school.

We have had a number of significant staff shortages this week in all areas of the school and the Radstock staff team are pulling together to cover these absences. We will try and minimise disruption to your children but please bear with us.

Y3 Geology workshop

For Y3 parents



As part of their learning project on Rocks, Relics and Rumbles, Year 3 experienced a geology workshop in the first week of term. The children learnt about the geographical features of earthquakes and volcanos.

One learning activty was where the children used the different terminology to discuss how a volcano erupts, using orange plastic to illustrate the magma flow and eruption.

Another learning activity was where the children explored myths from different countries about volcanos and earthquakes. Safa from Miss Bell's class told me the story of how Loki had a jar of poison held over his head which a snake dripped venom from his fangs into. Every little while, the poison in the jar would pour down Loki's face and he would shake his head in pain, causing earthquakes across the world. The children then created freeze frames to portray scenes from the story.
